



The route leads to 20 historically significant sites - each one a memorable treasure. Explore the Depot Museum, Historic Ironwood Theatre, Memorial Municipal Building and more. Experience over 130 years of history and discover the rich past of the mining and logging era when it began in Ironwood in the late 1890s.

These structures serve as a living text book of the fine starchitectural achievements of America sgolden age.
